WHEREAS: the Town of Arietta in April 2019 entered into an Agreement for emergency medical and ambulance services including prehospital emergency treatment and Advanced Life Support ("ALS") fly car services for its residents and non-residents for medical emergencies occurring in the Town, and

WHEREAS: under General Municipal Law 122-b the Town may provide for such services, and

WHEREAS: the Town has received a new Consent, Assignment and Assumption of Agreement for Ambulance Service as GAVAC has agreed to sell substantially all its assets to Lake Valley EMS, and Lake Valley EMS will commence the provision of ambulance services in the same area previously served by GAVAC as per the attached Agreement, and

WHEREAS: the Assignor GAVAC hereby assigns, sells, transfers, and conveys to Assignee Lake Valley EMS, as of the Effective Date, all the Assignor's right, title, interest, and obligations under the Agreement, and

WHEREAS: the Assignee Lake Valley EMS hereby (a) assumes all of the Assignor's right, title, interest, and obligations under the Agreement, and (b) agrees to perform, and be bound by, all obligations and satisfy all conditions to be performed or satisfied by Assignor under the provisions of the Agreement, and

WHEREAS: the Town of Arietta consents to this Assignment and Assumption and agrees that, commencing upon the Effective Date of this Assignment, it will look solely to Assignee Lake Valley EMS as its ambulance service provider under the Agreement, and

THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED: the Town Board of the Town of Arietta hereby approves the Consent, Assignment, and Assumption of Agreement for Ambulance Service, as per the attachment, by and among the Towns of Arietta and Lake Pleasant, Municipal Corporations in New York ("Towns"), Greater Amsterdam Volunteer Ambulance CORPS ("GAVAC"), and Priority Ambulance New York, LLC d/b/a Lake Valley EMS ("Lake Valley EMS") and authorizes the supervisor to execute the agreement on behalf of the Town of Arietta.

SNOWMOBILE TRAILS: Jacqui Grier- reported that we cannot trade free phone service for Frontier's lease on the phone building.

<u>INTERNAL MANAGEMENT/INSURANCE</u>, <u>RECREATION</u>, <u>WEBSITE & CHAMBER</u>- Christy Wilt had nothing new to report.

<u>LAKE/DAM/INVASIVE/CAMPSITESUPERINTENDENT REPORT</u>: Sarah Rudes had questions regarding the boards in the dam. Supervisor Rhodes stated that ½ of the boards had been removed due to the excessive rain we have had recently. She would like to be notified when the boards are taken out and replaced.

<u>CODES AND ZONING</u>: Mel LaScola reported he had sent a letter to Janet Annan regarding the demolished house in Higgins Bay. She contacted him and stated it would be removed before the 30 days are up. A copy of the letter he sent was shown to the board. He also stated he had issued a stop work order to Piseco Company for doing work without a permit. There was a fine for this and the fine has been paid.

HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT: Craig Small reported the work on Haskell Road is on hold for now. The paving company is in Vermont working on the road damage due to flooding. The local equipment is being used in Long Lake to help repair the washouts and road damage caused by flooding.

AIRPORT AND FINANCE Supervisor Rhodes had nothing new to report on the Airport.

<u>OLD BUSINESS:</u> Supervisor Rhodes reported that the Pickett Memorial Company came up and looked at the existing veterans memorial stone, he took measurements and said there is sufficient space for more names. A discussion followed regarding who's names should be on the stone.

Jodi Small inquired whether the town will be doing yearly audits.

Mary Kiewicz introduced Kathy Garrett. She gave information regarding the potential moving of invasive species if someone takes dirt/material from the "stump dump." She gave multiple examples of what those species are.

Supervisor Rhodes asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting, Motion was offered by Jacqui Grier, seconded by Doug Stobo. Meeting adjourned at 5:53.
